Dr. Clark School Students and Families,

It has been a difficult time for our community and for many of our families. Our hearts go out to those of you who are going through the devastating loss of your homes, severe damage to homes or a continued displacement from your neighbourhoods.

Although we have not had school for the past several weeks, I feel it is important to keep in contact with you on some updates for Dr. Clark School as we officially end our 2015/2016 school year. Staff have all been sent in many directions in past weeks, but we continue to plan ahead for next year.

Our school has been undergoing intense cleaning by a restoration company. They are scrubbing every inch of the school, including removing white boards/bulletin boards and cleaning behind them. Items that could be affected by smoke are cleaned or removed. I understand that they will begin the process of replacing all the ceiling tiles in the next few days. The school will be a clean, smoke-free, healthy environment when students return in September.

In September we will welcome Beacon Hill School students and staff to our building. This will be considered "a school within a school" as our former Junior High wing temporarily becomes Beacon Hill School. Although located within the Dr. Clark School building, they will be able to maintain their own school community as well as work alongside with our staff and students for some events and activities.

The staff of Dr. Clark miss our students and families dearly. The end of the school year is always a special time with our students and we wish we had the opportunity to have that time with the children this year. We hope to see you all back in September, but realize that may not be possible for some families. For those who are leaving us, we hope that you take with you fond memories of our school. We wish you all well.

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In the spring we sent home a survey to determine interest level for the establishment of a Before/After School Care within Dr. Clark.

Thank you to all who responded to the survey. We recognize that childcare is a need and there is definite interest for it in our school. We will continue to work to try to bring in a before/after school childcare program in the future.



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In April, we piloted a plan for new traffic flow through our front parking lot with the introduction of the “Stop and Drop” zone. This trial period was very successful and created a safer area for students to be dropped off and improved traffic flow. We will continue with this next year. Lines will be painted and signage will be posted to indicate this zone.

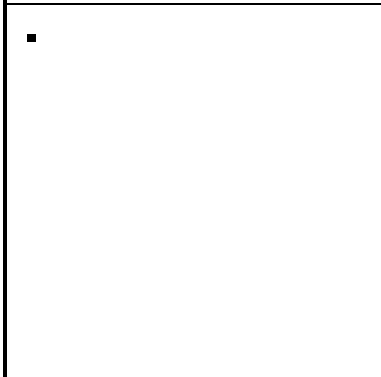
