FIRST NATIONS, MÉTIS, INUIT

This month, our sacred teaching is on the buffalo, which focuses on the teaching of "Respect". Classrooms are planning visits to the Indigenous Numeracy Mural and having a large class discussion about the Buffalo. Full Circle Mentorship also starts this month. Each week, selected students will participate in one Indigenous teaching or activity including but not limited to Drummi

Dream Catcher crafting, bannock making, 7 Sacred Teachings, Medicine Wheels, Christmas celebrations, Aboriginal Day celebration, Indigenous history and language. As Full Circle is, at its core, a mentoring program, facilitators will always prioritize the development of positive mentoring relationships with program

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participants. As a Legacy School part of the Downie-Wenjack Foundation, we participated in Secret Path Week 17 - 22 and students were able to learn about Chanie Wenjack and as part of their reconciliation efforts, joined in a Walk For Wenjack.


