Each year on September 30th, people all across Canada wear orange shirts to remember First Nations, Métis and Inuit children who were forced to attend residential schools. Orange was picked because of residential school survivor Phyllis Westad whose story is available **HERE**.

Earlier this year, the government of Canada decided to keep a promise they made to residential school Survivors like Phyllis and to show that they matter. September 30th was made into a new holiday, but not the kind of holiday where we celebrate. This new holiday is to show respect to residential school Survivors and their families and to make a promise that this will never happen again. It is called the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. We will use the day to learn more about residential schools. To listen with our ears, our minds and our hearts. To think about what we can do to make sure we respect each other and work together for a hopeful future for everyone.
