Challenges can look like:

- Easily distracted when working on a task
- Multiple unfinished tasks
- Easily frustrated when things don't go as planned
- Loss of interest with long term tasks
- May not finish a task due to it being difficult
- Fear of failure
- Negative self-talk

Strategies to Support Response Inhibition:

- Set small achievable goals
- Conduct frequent check ins
- Use first/then strategy
- Create a plan with multiple checkpoints
- Take a break from challenging tasks and come back to it later
- Ask for help when encountering setbacks
- Celebrate all accomplishments big and small!
